Course Description:

Ceramics 2

Grade level: 9-12

Length of course: 1 semester

Credit: .5

Artists and designers experiment with forms, structures, materials, concepts, media, and art making approaches. Artists and designers balance experimentation and safety, freedom and responsibility while developing and creating artworks. People create and interact with objects, places, and design that define, shape, enhance, and empower their lives. Clarity of visual organization supports effective communication. This course will provide students with extended knowledge, skills and vocabulary to further their art experience.

In Ceramics 2, students will learn:

- To apply the necessary vocabulary to discuss 3D art
- To apply basic ceramic building technique to create art and design
- To explore techniques to reinforce the 3D art vocabulary and terminology

Notification of the Right to Object to the Use of Materials
