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Many young people successfully transition from adolescence to adulthood with the support of their families, friends, adults, communities and schools. But for some youth, this time can be challenging, and additional assistance can be helpful in finding the path to success. This is where the Youth Transition Program (YTP) comes in.

YTP is a unique vocational program offered by our school district in partnership with the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation Services, Oregon Department of Education, and the University of Oregon. YTP assists students with disabilities by addressing barriers and challenges to employment so they successfully transition from school to post-high school opportunities.
